PRESIDING BISHOP'S EPISTLE

Praised be Jesus Christ! What a joy and honour it has been to serve as your Presiding and Diocesan Bishop for three months now, a whirlwind experience of meetings, phone calls, Zoom meetings, travel, and engagements in and through which I have been privileged firsthand to witness the tremendous vitality, energy, growth, and excitement that defines our branch of Christ's Holy Catholic Church. The future has never been brighter for the Anglican Province of America, thanks to all of you! Having the ability to serve you is the greatest gift of my life – and I remain indescribably grateful for your love and support. In this, my first Presiding Bishop's Epistle, I would like to share a brief recap of all the events that have transpired for me personally since my Enthronement as your Bishop Ordinary on 22nd July and Installation as Presiding Bishop on 23rd July. As one can tell from the following narrative, the first few months of new leadership have been invested in interacting with our people and engaging in new efforts towards parish growth, spiritual education and formation, and ecumenism.

On 8th August, my first episcopal visitation as Diocesan occurred at Christ the Redeemer Church, Warner Robins, Georgia for celebration of the parish's feast of title, the Transfiguration of Our Lord.

On 10th August, it was necessary for us officially to close the mission of Christ the King Church, Douglasville, Georgia, which had dwindled. We shall forever remain grateful for the devoted ministry of the Reverend Canon Edward Warner, who now enjoys a well-deserved retirement.

From 19th to 22nd August, I made an episcopal visitation to the mission of Saint Matthias Church, Dothan, Alabama, which is making amazing progress and may soon be in a position to begin in earnest its

construction of a new Church building. Please continue to pray for Father Stephen Miller and the faithful of Saint Matthias. Wonderful things are happening there!

Little did I realise what a treat was in store when I visited Saint Paul's Church, Melbourne, Florida from 25th to 27th August to bless and open the new Saint Paul's Classical School. Father Brian Oldfield, Father Raymond Davison, and the staff of the parish and school have achieved wonders already, and as of this writing, twelve students are now enrolled in this newest educational venture in the APA. The school is housed in an absolutely beautiful and state-of-the-art facility – the school could not be better or more professionally organised.

On 11th September I was delighted to offer a retreat entitled 'O Salutaris Hostia: The Eucharist in the Life of the Church' for the faithful at Holy Cross Church, Knoxville, Tennessee. My official episcopal visitation followed the next day, Sunday 12th September. We enjoyed a splendid and active weekend together with great attendance.

On 18th September I was blessed beyond measure to ordain the Reverend William Joshua Kimbril to the Sacred Order of Deacons at Saint George the Martyr Church, Simpsonville, South Carolina. Deacon Kimbril now serves as Curate to the Very Reverend Paul Rivard.

The newly-appointed DEUS Domestic Missions Team spent a fantastic and productive three days meeting at Ridgecrest Conference Centre in Black Mountain, North Carolina from 19th to 22nd September preparing for our future work on behalf of our Diocese. The team took time to identify those parishes and missions which may benefit from

revitalisation and also to develop a plan for the creation of a new mission congregation in DEUS in 2023. The ideas and programme coming forward will be of intense benefit for our common life and outreach. We thank the Reverend Canon Wade Miller, Dean Paul Rivard, Father Myles Hixson, and Father Mark Perkins for their ministries and commitment.

On 22nd September, our Diocesan family assembled to offer the Requiem Mass for the blessed repose of the priestly soul of Father Gregory P. Miller, who died in office as Rector of Saint Matthew's Church, Weaverville, North Carolina on 16th September. Please pray for Father Greg, and for the comfort and peace of his beloved wife Shirley, his son Father Stephen Miller and Father Steve's wife Jennifer, and the entire Miller family. The parish of Saint Matthew's is now entering its search for a new Rector. Please keep the parish and its efforts to call a new Rector in your daily prayers. It was a true gift to spend the day with Saint Matthew's Church on 10th October for Sunday Mass and a congregational meeting.

On 23rd September I was deeply humbled to be invited to provide the keynote banquet address at the Provincial Synod of the Anglican Catholic Church. The theme was 'healthy Anglo-Catholic Churches, what to do – and not to do.' At the ACC Synod, the Diocese of the Holy Cross officially joined the ACC as a constituent Diocese of the Original Province of the ACC, and thus, with that merger now accomplished, the Anglican Joint Synods were reduced in number from four to three, with the 'G3' now being the Anglican Catholic Church, the Anglican Church in America, and the Anglican Province of America. The G3 is a good development, as it means our jurisdictions are continuing to unite and more closely collaborate.

On 2nd October I attended the Deanery meeting of the Deep South in Warner Robins, Georgia, where seven of our clergy gathered for a day of reflection, prayer, and a liturgical practicum on the Low Mass as celebrated according to the Missal. The Very Reverend Matthew Harlow is Dean and Canon to the Ordinary.

The fifth official meeting of the Anglican Joint Synods-Polish National Catholic Church Dialogue transpired at Holy Trinity PNCC Cathedral in Manchester, New Hampshire, from 4th to 6th October. Our Churches were in full communion from 1946 to 1978, and we pray that our once happy relationship can be rediscovered and reinvigorated. The dialogue is making a slow but steady progression.

A highlight of the year arrived on Sunday 17th October, when I was elated to institute Father Wesley Walker as the new Rector of Saint Paul's Church, Crownsville, Maryland. Father Walker is exercising a terrific and powerful ministry at Saint Paul's, and the Sunday of his institution saw a packed Church. The day before, Saturday the 16th, witnessed another retreat on the same quintessentially important theme of the Eucharist: 'O Salutaris Hostia.'

Impending visitations will include All Saints' Church, Mills River, North Carolina, Saint Philip's Church, Blacksburg, Virginia, and Saint Martin's Church, Ocala, Florida. It is hoped that a meeting between the Primate of the Traditional Anglican Church (TAC) and your Presiding Bishop will take place in British Columbia, Canada, before the end of 2021, so that our jurisdictions may lay the groundwork for a full *communio in sacris* agreement between the APA and TAC in the near future, thus bringing the international Continuum into an even more intimate fellowship and cooperation.

Spring Clergy Conference and Committee meetings

We eagerly look forward to our first ever Spring APA Clergy Conference, to be held from Monday 25th to Wednesday 27th April 2022, at Ridgecrest Conference Centre in Black Mountain, North Carolina, one of the loveliest towns in the entire country! The teaching theme for the Conference will be 'The Liturgy: An Explanation of the Theology and Practice of the Missal.' Our Conference will afford the opportunity for prayer and fellowship, mutual study, and time just to be together and enjoy one another's company. There will be plenty of time to enjoy the sights around Black Mountain and to take

in the natural beauty of the region as well as the wonderful dining and shopping in town. One can even join me on a little fishing expedition! We enthusiastically encourage all clergy to attend. Updated information will be sent to everyone very soon indeed. All APA clergy, deaconesses, postulants, deaconess candidates, committee members, and their spouses are invited from any part of our Province.

Title Clarification

The Most Reverend Walter H. Grundorf, D.D., our beloved retired Presiding and Diocesan Bishop (DEUS), retains the title "the Most Reverend."

DEUS Synod Recap

The 53rd Synod of the Diocese of the Eastern United States was held from 20th to 22nd July 2021, at the DoubleTree Atlanta Perimeter Hotel in Dunwoody, Georgia, sponsored by Saint Barnabas Cathedral. On Wednesday 21st July the Diocese and Province celebrated with a beautiful banquet the ministry of our retiring Diocesan and Presiding Bishop Walter H. Grundorf, D.D., with special presentations and various gifts, including the first ever Bishop Chambers Award from the Joint Synod Bishops "for

his many years of dedicated service to the cause of traditional Anglicanism, his commitment to The Affirmation of Saint Louis and his ecumenical efforts that culminated in the historic *communio in sacris* agreement of 2017."

On Thursday 22nd July, our fourth Diocesan Bishop, Chandler Holder Jones, was solemnly enthroned as the Ordinary at Saint Barnabas. The new Episcopal staff was announced: Daniel Wilder, CPA was elected as DEUS (and later APA) Treasurer; Charles Miller, Esq., was appointed as DEUS and APA Chancellor; Lisa Ulrich will continue as Diocesan and Provincial Executive Secretary, as will Bishop William Perkins as DEUS Suffragan Bishop. Other DEUS Appointments are: Fr. Erich Zwingert, Prebendary; Fathers Mark Menees and Michael Ward, Archdeacons; Fr. Matthew Harlow, Canon to the Ordinary and Dean of the Deep South; Fr. Glenn Spencer, Canon Theologian; Fr. Wade Miller, Canon Missioner; Fr. J. Gordon Anderson, Canon for Liturgy and the Arts. Area Deans are: The Very Reverends, Fr. Anderson, Mid-Atlantic; Fr. Harlow, Deep South; Fr. Menees, Central & Eastern Carolinas; Fr. Paul Rivard, Appalachia; Fr. Ralph Waterhouse, Central Florida, and Bishop Perkins, South Florida. The Bishop's Advisory Committees and the Board of Examining Chaplains were appointed. The Standing Committee and members of various Boards were elected and/or appointed.

DMA and DOW merger finalized - now Diocese of the Central and Western States (DCWS)

The Diocese of Mid-America (DMA) and the Diocese of the West (DOW) voted to merge their two dioceses at their respective Synods from 21st to 22nd July 2021, later meeting together for the signing of the resolution document to be presented to the Provincial Synod. The DMA and DOW have completed the work to create a new and unified Diocese that is the presence of the APA west of the Mississippi River to the Pacific Coast and south to the border of Mexico. Their new name is Diocese of the Central and Western States (DCWS) under the leadership of the Rt. Rev. Robert Todd Giffin, D.D., Bishop Ordinary. The Diocesan Administrator will remain Norma Jean Giffin, as will the Archdeacon, the Ven. Franklin Endres. The Canon to the Ordinary is Fr.

Robert Cheeseman; The Canon for Pastoral Care, Fr. Yossi Sarid; Dean of the Northwest, Fr. Robert Hawkins; and Diocesan Missioners, Fathers Ian Dunn and John Lohmann. A complete list of new officers and appointments, including committee members is available on the APA website under the news article "A New Diocese is Formed." In addition to establishing leadership and committee roles, the diocese has developed a Diocesan Newsletter to help keep the spread-out diocese in touch with its members. The newsletter is called the "Diocesan Messenger," and is managed by Anne Fincke of All Saints Church, Prescott, Arizona.

Provincial Synod Recap

Several major events occurred during the Provincial Synod, held at the same location as the Diocesan Synods. The proposed merger of the Diocese of Mid-America and the Diocese of the West was unanimously ratified to proceed by the Provincial Synod on Thursday, 22nd July. The Most Rev. Walter H. Grundorf gave his final Synod Address. There was a change of other key positions in the APA and DEUS. D.J. Fulton, provincial and diocesan treasurer, retired after 13 years, as did Glen Wieland after more than 30 years as chancellor. Mr. Fulton and Mr. Wieland were honored at Provincial Synod for their long years of service when Bishop Grundorf presented them with the Companions of St. George Award, occasionally presented to outstanding laypeople in the APA. Officers and Members of the Provincial Council were elected, including Fr. Ian Dunn as Secretary of Provincial Synod (and Provincial Council). The following day, Friday 23rd July, at the conclusion of the Provincial Synod of the APA, Bishop Jones was elected the second Presiding Bishop of the APA and installed into his office during the final Mass of the Synod.

Anglican Youth Camp 2022

Anglican Youth Camp is back for 2022! Camp will be from 5th to 11th June, in Westfield, NC. Bishop Jones is returning as Camp Spiritual Director and Father Matt Harlow as the Camp Director. This year's program will focus on: "What does it mean to be an Anglican?" In addition to daily Mass and Anglican Studies, we will have all of the camp activities we love such as: Swimming, Archery, Riflery, Canoeing,

Paint Ball, and High Ropes. The cost per Camper is \$425. If a parish or an individual would look to help offset costs, we need donations and scholarships. If you are interested in being a Camp Counselor, please let Fr. Matt know. Camp is open to youth aged 8-15, 16 if you have attended the camp previously.
